POSITIONING, MARKETING AND SALES

In the power positioning session by Ahmad Munawar, we delved into the continuous process of navigating the business landscape, stressing the importance of defining our target audience and standing out for premium pricing. The marketing session focused on adapting to dynamic markets, offering insights into effective strategies and enabling attendees to discuss their cases one-on-one in hot seats. The sales session explored the art of persuading customers, emphasizing market dynamics, effective communication, and understanding client needs. Hot seats provided participants with the opportunity to engage in personalized discussions with the business coach, gaining instant feedback on their sales challenges in the everchanging market.



BRANDING

Brittni talked about how to make your workshops special by adding your own personality and brand. She explained who you are as a person and as a brand. She shared tricks to make your workshops more interesting, not just during, but also before and after. Brittni showed us simple ways to create special moments that people will remember, in line with our unique brands. Her session was like a helpful guide, teaching us how to make workshops not just fun but also memorable. We learned easy ways to make our workshops stand out and leave a lasting impression on everyone.



VISUAL FACILITATION

Axelle, the creator of Drawify (also a plugin for Miro), taught us about the power of drawing in a simple and fun way. She used visuals to show how effective drawing can be, especially during Brittni's workshop. In the evening, Axelle shared easy tips to improve drawing skills and boost confidence. She proved that everyone can draw, breaking the myth of "I can't draw." Axelle highlighted the strength of visuals in creative brainstorming, inspiring us to use drawings in our workshops. Her session left us with newfound skills and confidence, ready to incorporate the fun and impact of drawing into our own workshops.





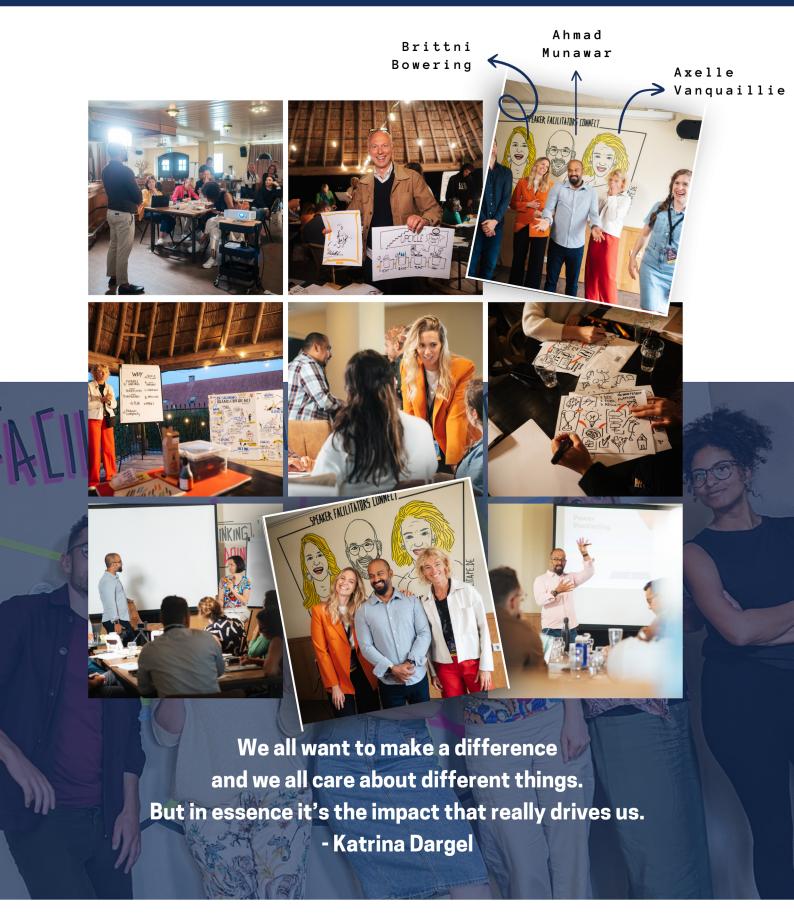




























AI DESIGN SPRINTS

Of course, with some helpful tips from Marc (our photographer!)





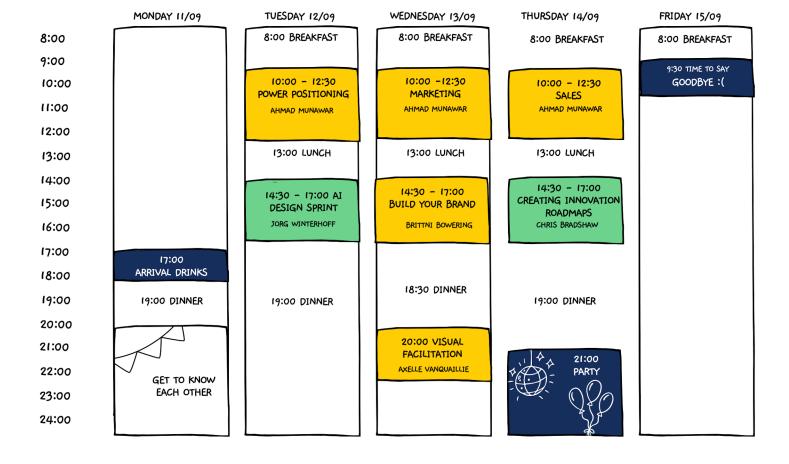

Our community is like a lively hub where both experienced facilitators and newbies can do well. It's a friendly online spot where we share experiences, ideas, and keep learning together.

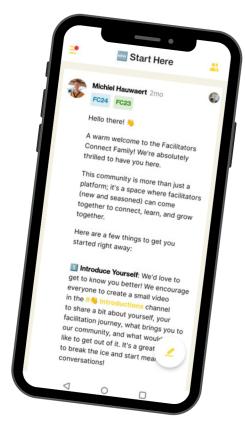

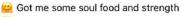
I'm all about connecting, inspiring, and guiding people. It's in my DNA, a
